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Château Sainte Roseline

The vineyard of Château Sainte Roseline enjoys an exceptional terroir in Provence: the clay-limestone soils and the presence of a deep source allow a controlled supply of the vine, a guarantee of obtaining great wines. He was also rewarded in 1955 with the "CRU CLASSÉ" distinction. Today, the AOP Côtes de Provence Cru Classé vineyard extends over 110 hectares where 11 grape varieties are grown, thus allowing the production of rosé, white and red wines within our Sainte Roseline vineyard.

401. Condrieu, Domaine Lionel Faury, Rhone, France 15% 2018 £100.00

Aromas of pear, peach and apricot with undertones of honey, quince and toasted spice. Ripe, round and opulent on the palate with a lovely ample texture and verging slightly tropical fusing with an abundance of white pepper spice on the finish.

402. Saint-Aubin, 'Champ Tirant' Domaine G. Thomas, Burgundy, France 14% 2021 £115.00

Bright, slightly floral nose with honey suckle, white stone fruits and added green apple fruit. The palate is juicy with lots of pure green apple, pear, and citrus fruit. Wonderful vibrant and fresh thanks to zippy acidity.

403. Meursault, 'Narvaux', Vincent Latour, Burgundy 13% 2020 £120.00

Refined aromas of lemon, apple and honeysuckle. Wonderful power, structure, and balance throughout due to the ample and generous texture, which is complemented by racy, linear acidity with more white stone fruit and white pepper spice.

404. Chablis, Grand Cru, Blanchot, Samuel Billaud Burgundy, France 13% 2019 £140.00

The most easterly of all Chablis Grand Cru vineyards, where the location on clay-limestone soils and extended sunshine hours creates a refined and sophistication wine.

Inviting aromas of ripe lemon, green apple with added peach and apricot. Rich and creamy with serious power and structure, perfectly balanced by fresh, linear acidity and well-integrated oak. A seriously impressive Grand Cru.

406. Kumeu River, Mate's Vineyard, Chardonnay, Auckland, New Zealand 13% 2021 £160.00

The highly rated Chardonnay named after the founder of Kumeu River.

The wine oozes Burgundian power, but still offers trademark purity of fruit flavour we have come to expect from New Zealand. Fantastic length and creamy texture.

407. Pouilly-Fuissé, 'Esprit Mineral', Saumaize-Michelin, Burgundy, France 13% 2018 £185.00

Aromatic nose of lemon, apple, and pear with subtle hints of vanilla spice balanced by the refreshing, mineral acidity that wraps around the core of both citrus and white stone fruits.

408. Puligny-Montrachet, 1er Cru, Jean-Louis Chavy, 'Les Folatieres', Burgundy 13.5% 2018 £195.00

A fuller and richer nose in comparison to standard Puligny, with notes of lemon citrus and white stone fruits. Great purity and precision that flows through to a mineral-driven finish.

409. Chassagne-Montrachet, Domaine Rene Monnier, Burgundy, France 13% 2014 £200.00

A complex nose of almond and fresh apricot accompanied by vanilla and butterscotch notes.

The wine is full bodied with apricot dominating the fresh fruit palate. The finish is buttery with hints of toasty oak.

411. Corton Charlemagne, Grand Cru, Cote d'Or, Louis Latour, Burgundy 14% 2017 £355.00

Round with a pungent bouquet of grilled almonds, vanilla and smoky hints.

The mouth is powerful and persistent with integrated oak and a long, mineral finish.

- 501. Malbec, Mendoza, Nicolas Catena Zapata, Bodegas Catena, Argentina** 13.5% 2018 £175.00
 Bodega Catena Zapata and Nicolás Catena have both been instrumental in the development of fine wine production in Argentina. Aromas of blackberries, blackcurrants and earth. Full-bodied with dense dark berries. A blend of Cabernet Sauvignon and Malbec.
- 502. Hermitage Rouge, Yann Chave, Rhône Valley, France** 15% 2019 £175.00
 Crafted from Syrah grapes taken from the Chave family's vineyards near the village of Mercurool. Powerful, purple fruit character and peppery spice. Blackcurrant, cassis, and liquorice. A gladiator of a wine.
- 503. Château Batailley, Grand Cru Classé, Pauillac, Bordeaux** 13.5% 2015 £175.00
 Impressive depth to the wine from the outset with a smoky edge to the ripe blackberries, blueberries and red plums. Some attractive spicy oak, with a long, succulent, regal finish. Great polish and balance here; the structure is superb.
- 504. Cabernet Sauvignon, Cape Mentelle, Margaret River, Western Australia** 14.5% 2017 £190.00
 The palate has a powerful rush of cocoa powder, with dark forest berry fruits of blackcurrant and mulberry, peppered with notes of spiced ginger and caramel toffee.
- 505. Barolo, Dagromis, Gaja, Piedmont, Italy** 14% 2015 £200.00
 Clean and expressive, both on the nose and on the palate, it opens with floral notes of rose petal and elderflowers then black pepper and tobacco. The palate features sweet red cherry, plum and blueberry.
- 506. Château Talbot, Saint Julien, Bordeaux, France** 13.5% 2015 £200.00
 A big, rich wine from St. Julien with plenty of power and concentration, which enables it to carry plenty of spicy and toasty oak. Bright, red berry nose with a touch of cranberry. Black fruit palate with spice and oak.
- 507. Nuits-Saint-Georges, 'Les Damodes', Premier Cru, Louis Latour, Burgundy** 13.5% 2017 £220.00
 Powerful nose, with aromas of cherry and liquorice. Aromas continue with coffee and undergrowth. This wine reveals a beautiful length on the palate. Silky tannins and blackberry aromas with bright acidity.
- 508. Château Rauzan-Ségla, Margaux, Bordeaux, France** 13% 2017 £225.00
 Rauzan-Ségla is one of the leading estates in Margaux and sets the standard for top quality. Full-bodied with aromas of stewed red and black plums, chocolate-covered cherries and raspberry coulis, leading to liquorice, red roses and menthol and unsmoked cigars. The palate is elegant, yet has serious intensity.
- 509. Corton-Grancey, Grand Cru, Louis Latour, Burgundy, France** 14% 2012 £255.00
 "Grancey" was the name of the last owners of the Château situated on the road of Corton, before the Latour family bought it in 1891. It is a blend of five areas of Domaine Latour Corton Grand Cru: Bressandes, Perrières, Grèves, Clos du Roi, and Chaumes. The average age of the vines are over 40 years. An intense ruby colour. Clean and fresh on the nose, aromas of cassis and liquorice emerge. A powerful wine with a slightly minty aftertaste.

- 510. Château Lynch-Bages, Pauillac, Bordeaux, France** 13% 2004 £360.00
 One of the most famous Château. In Bordeaux, consistently punching above its fifth growth status. Oz Clarke famously said: "Lynch-Bages is impressive at five years, beautiful at ten, and irresistible at twenty". On the nose it shows gentle smoked oak, bitter cocoa beans and liquorice, giving balance the the fresh acidities that stud the blackberry and raspberry fruits.
- 511. Barbaresco, DOCG, Gaja, Piedmont, Italy** 14% 2016 £515.00
 Expressive spice and floral notes open up first. Sweet red cherry, mint, cinnamon and rose petal develop in the glass, adding further shades of nuance.
- 512. Château L'Eglise-Client, Denis Durantou, Pomerol, Bordeaux, France** 14.5% 2015 £625.00
 L'Eglise- Client comes bursting out of the glass with a gorgeous perfume of exotic spices and potpourri over a core of blueberry compote, red currant jelly, spiced black plums and mulberries with touches of unsmoked cigars, powdered cinnamon and liquorice. Big, rich, and full-bodied, the palate offers exquisite harmony, packed with exotic spice and red and black fruit layers, finishing on an epically long-lasting mineral note.
- 513. Cote-de-Rotie, 'La Mouline', E.Guigal, Rhone, France** 14% 2015 £950.00
 Listed as one of the 'Treasures' in the Guigal portfolio. 400 case production each year, Regarded as one of the most emblematic of the Guigal domain's wines. A strong contender for one of the most exotic and erotic wines on the planet. The intoxicating perfume offers floral, spice, bacon fat, pepper, earth, truffle, black and red fruit, minerality and kirsch liqueur. The texture is polished, rich, and concentrated but never over powering.

Therefore, Gosset has been specially selected as the house pour Champagne for all our guests to enjoy, appreciate and discover. Gosset's signature style focuses on freshness and acidity, really lending itself to gastronomical food pairing, yet maintaining enough elegance as the perfect aperitif.

The history of the Gosset family goes back five centuries to Jean Gosset (1484-1556), "Lord of Aÿ and Mareuil", who was the first official ancestor in the lineage. The origins of "Maison Gosset" itself date back to the year 1584 when Pierre Gosset, Lord and Alderman of Aÿ, decided to set up a négociant business.

16 generations, all of direct lineage, have continued to build upon his work in Aÿ-Champagne and ensured that Champagne Gosset's savoir-faire, based on the family's traditional craftsmanship, lives on.

Charming nose of lemon citrus, apple with undertones of ripe Cantaloupe melon. Very pure and precise with impressive chalky minerality on the long, fine finish.

109. Viognier, Le Versant, Languedoc-Roussillon, France 13.5% £36.00

Full-bodied and flavoursome with appealing flavours of apricot and floral citrus and a delicate hint of oak. A lovely fresh acidity closes the deal.

110. Defesa Branco, Esporao, Alentejo, Portugal 13.5% £38.00

A seriously underrated wine and excellent value for money. Hints of citrus fruits, apricot, and fresh mango. In the mouth, the freshness, and the aromatic intensity excels, in a rich, juicy and balanced array. Top wine from a top producer. Very food friendly.

111. Gewurztraminer, Joseph Cattin, Alsace, France 14% £38.00

Bright pale gold with exotic aromas of lychee and mango and a delicate touch of rose water. On the palate, ripe exotic fruits mingle with spicy, floral flavours and a long-lasting finish.

112. Pinot Gris, Esk Valley, Hawkes Bay, New Zealand 14% £45.00

Spicy citrus on the nose, with a lovely lemon lift. With elegant notes of herbs and white flowers.

113. Chardonnay, Mâcon-Uchizy, Cave Talmard, Burgundy, France 13% £45.00

The wine is unoaked, medium bodied, has lovely citrus/ripe pear flavours and a long, crisp finish. The attack in the mouth is full, rich and fruity.

115. Chardonnay, Robert Oatley Signature Series Margaret River, Australia 12.5% £48.00

A bright, mid-weight, white peach-accented, gently oaked wine grown on selected sites across Australia's highest performing Chardonnay region.

116. Clos des Lunes, 'Lune d'Argent' Bordeaux Blanc, France 13% £52.00

A blend of 70% Sémillon and 30% Sauvignon Blanc from 65-hectares of vineyards split between the sub-zones of Sauternes (adjacent to Chateau d'Yquem!). Impressive nose of exotic white peach, grapefruit and honeysuckle. Crisp and vibrant on the palate with a lovely creamy finish.

117. Riesling, Kabinett, 'Wehlener Sonnenuhr', Mosel-Saar-Ruwer, Germany 8.5% £55.00

The classic blue slate soil gives the wine a delicate, crisp acidity that perfectly balances the pure peach and lemon fruit.

118. Chardonnay, Montagny, 1er Cru, Buissonnier, Vignerons de Buxy, Burgundy 14% £58.00

Lovely refreshing white from the Cote Chalonnaise, taken from clay and limestone rich vineyards around the town of Montagny. Plenty of spritzy citrus, stone fruit and green apple flavours, with a silky finish.

 Full of bright green fruit and vibrant citrus flavours, this is an excellent benchmark for young, fresh Soave. Rounded, ripe fruit is perfectly balanced almost aromatic nose with citrus and stone fruits. Elegant in style with surprising length and purity.

 Loads of gooseberry and passion fruit, with flinty, fresh acidity. Fresh citrus nose with gooseberry and floral notes with further citrus on the palate with the classic herbaceous minerality.
- 123. Albariño, Pazos de Lusco, Rías Baixas, Spain 13%** **£62.00**
 Meaning 'sunset' in the local Galician dialect, Lusco is a vibrant, bright, and full-bodied Albariño. It has a powerful nose with aromas of fresh herbs, tropical fruits and floral tones. Fresh and complex on the palate, the wine is soft and refined, a stellar wine from this region.
- 124. Chardonnay, Saint-Veran, 'Preludes', Terres Secretes, Brugundy, France 13%** **£68.00**
 Intense nose of exotic fruit fused with white blossom and acacia honey. Wonderful purity that compliments the multi-layered core with flavours of pineapple, peach and citrus that all fuse together with energetic, refreshing acidity. A touch of cinnamon spice on the finish seals the deal.

 Charming nose of lemon citrus fused with white peach and delicate hints of honey. Rich and round on the palate with good weight and a creamy finish.

 Attractive nose, slightly herbaceous with integrated peach and citrus fruit. Oozing with character on the palate. Complex, silky texture with a festival of citrus and tropical flavours under pinned with minerality and plenty of freshness. Marathon finish.
- 127. Chardonnay, White Lady, Warwick Estate, Stellenbosch, South Africa 13.5% 2019** **£72.00**
 Very much like a white Burgundy, matured in French oak barrels. Rich, lush honeysuckle and green apples. Creamy and seductive with a touch of tropical fruit and coconut. A refreshing citrus lift and complexity flows through into an impressive, slightly mineral finish.
- 128. Chateau Picque Caillou Blanc, Pessac-Leognan, Bordeaux Blanc, France 12.5% 2018** **£95.00**
 Located at the gates of Bordeaux, Chateau Picque Caillou is a 26 hectare vineyard with a long history. An estate on the rise! Complex aromas of dried pineapple, lemon zest, flint and toasted hazelnut on the nose. It's medium-bodied with sharp acidity. Gently waxy with a tangy, citrusy finish.

Impressive nose of juicy red and blackberry fruit with a touch of chocolate and game. Enhanced on the palate, very smooth, almost velvety black forest fruit.

312. Pinot Noir, Left Field, Marlborough, New Zealand 13.5%

£50.00

Juicy red berry fruits, strawberry and cherry are seamlessly intertwined with cinnamon and allspice. The palate is rich, warm, and supple with balanced acidity and a long finish.

313. Rioja Reserva, Cune, Rioja, Spain 14%

£58.00

Two years in American and French oak casks give lovely complexity and smooth tannins along with enticing bramble and sweet spice aromas.

314. Los Vascos, Cromas, Carmenere Grande Reserva, 14%

- 318. Château Lafite Rothschild, Réserve Spéciale, Pauillac, Bordeaux, France** 13% 2016 £100.00
 Deep crimson in colour, the nose is subtle and refined with aromas of liquorice and Morello cherries. The palate is elegant and well-structured with tight, dense tannins and a pleasant hint of liquorice on the finish, this wine already has a great deal of charm.
- 319. Chateauf-neuf-du-Pape Rouge, Roque Colombe, Rhone, Rhone, France** 15% 2019 £100.00
 Powerful and rich. This packs a real punch. Starting off fresh, you quickly get lots of peppery smokiness, which is well balanced by rich black cherry nuances.
- 320. Pinot Noir, Los Carneros, Cuvaison Estate, Napa Valley, California** 14% 2018 £110.00
 Striking nose of blackberry, black cherry and mulberry with notes of smoky oak spice. Bright and vibrant on the mid-palate balanced by silky, ripe tannins that wrap around a core of further bramble and hedgerow fruit with a savoury, gamey finish laden with white pepper spice.
- 321. Château Musar, Gaston Hochar, Beqaa Valley, Lebanon** 14% 2016 £120.00
 A Lebanese powerhouse of a wine. Chateau Musar Red has a dark burgundy colour, a nose of matured stone fruits, plums and figs with liquorice and spicy notes. It has big developed ripe fruit on the nose and a bold taste profile of juicy, black fruits plus mocha and leather. *Iconic producer!*
- 322. Volnay, Vieilles Vignes, Domaine Jean-Jacques Girard, Burgundy** 13% 2020 £120.00
 Imposing nose of black cherry, blackcurrant and blackberry. Big, bold, and powerful with firm, yet ripe tannins that fuse together with an abundance of black and bramble fruit underpinned by Asian spice. A classic Volnay.
- 323. Château Montrose, La Dame de Montrose, St Estephe, Bordeaux, France** 13% 2011 £125.00
 A linear and fine rendition of Montrose's second wine with blueberry and blackberry character, firm tannins and a juicy finish. Rather elegant and flattering without resorting to sweetness.
- 324. Amarone della Valpolicella Classico, Zenato, Veneto, Italy** 16.5% 2013 £150.00
 Considered the 'King of Veronese Wines', Amarone is made from grapes that have been left to dry on racks, which develops their distinct raisin and dried fruit character. This example is rich and vibrant, full of concentrated fruit and a smoky chocolate and coffee character.
- 325. Vosne Romanee, Vieilles Vignes, Roche de Bellene, Burgundy** 13% 2013 £150.00
 Charming fused red and black fruits with hints of floral tones on the nose. Seductive, concentrated nose that has wonderful complexity and depth.
- 326. Château Gloria, St Julien, Bordeaux, France** 13.5% 2011 £150.00
 Gloria produces some of the best value St. Julien wine available with blueberry and currant aromas, medium body, polished tannins and a juicy finish with hints of walnuts.
- 327. Château Pedesclaux, Pauillac, Bordeaux, France** 14% 2014 £150.00
 Chateau Pedesclaux is one of Pauillac's hidden gems, a First Growth property located nearby the iconic Mouton Rothschild and Pontet-Canet vineyards with the 2014 being a blend of 53% Cabernet Sauvignon and 47% Merlot producing an intense, deep and complex Pauillac.
- 328. Brunello di Montalcino, Casanova di Neri DOCG, Italy** 14.5% 2015 £170.00
 Established by Giovanni Neri, Casanova di Neri is now in the capable hands of his son Giacomo who produces exceptional wines from 100% Sangiovese with passion. Wines are really enticing with blueberry and cherry aromas as well as hints of hot stone and liquorice.
